






Rick and the Rick Hansen Foundation

- Altered perceptions and raised awareness of the potential of PwD
- Established the Rick Hansen Institute focused on SCI research
- Established what is now known as National AccessAbility Week
- Developed RHF Accessibility Certification, rating over 1,200 sites to-date
- Empower over 500,000 students per year via the RHF School Program
- Distributed over \$4M in access grants through Access4All Canada150
- Distributed over \$2M through the BC Accessibility Grants Program

Meaningful Access

Refers to:

- the ability to independently and safely access the built environment based on planned inclusion
- the level of access for the facility as a whole, not just the sum of its parts



RHF Accessibility CertificationTM

RHF Accessibility CertificationTM (RHFAC) is a rating system that measures the accessibility of the built environment using consistent methodology on a national and international scale.







What can be rated?

Built Environment

- Commercial, institutional, and public buildings
- Multi-unit residential buildings (e.g. excluding single-family homes)
- Trails and pathways recreational "front-country" trails or urban pathways considered accessible with clearly defined start and end points

Final Design Plans

Final design plans and drawings may be rated and awarded a provisional certification


RHFAC Benefits

- Defines what 'Access' really means using common methodology
- Provides an inventory of existing access issues. Facility operators become aware of the existing level of accessibility allowing them to action targeted improvements as part of long term planning
- RHFAC creates opportunities for business to take advantage of a vastly underutilized, reliable and educated workforce
- RHFAC creates pool of trained professionals that are proven proficient in developing access across the broad range of disability



Relationship with CSA Group


- The RHFAC Professional exam is administered by CSA Group
- All ratings are reviewed & given final approval by CSA Group
- The online RHFAC Registry is hosted by CSA Group
- Only sites which have approved to publicly list will be shown on the RHFAC Registry.



 RHFAC Professional Fee (required): charged by your RHFAC Professional to conduct an on-site rating and submit report to the Registry for adjudication. Fees vary based on size and complexity of the site.


