





British Columbia's Economic Base

Green = coniferous forest



Vancouver Island

Red = old growth forest

Green = younger forest



Every 20 seconds, a tree on Vancouver Island turns 250 years of age – which means it is officially old growth.



The B.C. coast has so much old growth forest that 1 soccer field (equivalent) could be harvested every hour for

500YEARS and we would never run e



Old Growth Management Areas = O.G.M.A

B.C. has 37,000 of these: "Defined areas that contain, or are managed to attain, specific structural oldgrowth attributes and that are delineated and mapped as fixed areas."


They cover an area as large as Vancouver Island.


