

Memorandum of Understanding

Between

the Surrey Board of Trade (SBOT)

and

the Resource Works Society

This MOU sets out the terms and understanding between the Surrey Board of Trade and the Resource Works Society on public-facing initiatives related to natural resources, reconciliation and Indigenous economic development.

Purpose

Under this MOU, the signing parties commit to jointly:

- Advance public awareness in British Columbia of the positive economic benefits of responsible natural resource development, in both rural and urban areas, including the City of Surrey.
- Build awareness of the importance of partnerships towards economic reconciliation and Indigenous economic development.
- Engage in and collaborate on special projects, including events, action plans, and reports, to ensure that balanced information about critically important economic issues is made available to members of the public, the news media and legislators.
- Cross-promote and amplify each other's work, where relevant, on social media and via newsletters.
- Enable reciprocal use of organizational logos across digital and media, under the header "Partner" or other language as approved by both parties.

Duration

This MOU is at-will and may be modified by mutual consent of authorized officials from Resource Works and the Surrey Board of Trade. This MOU shall become effective upon signature by the authorized officials and will remain in effect until modified or terminated by any one of the partners by mutual consent. In the absence of mutual agreement by the authorized officials, this MOU shall end on July 1, 2025.
