- Finding New Customers and Access to Markets



Most Significant Plant Management Issues for 2022







Supply Chain

National Supply Chain Task Force Report:

- 21 short / longer-term actions to reduce congestion, improve reliability and build resilience within Canada's transportation supply chain
 - Easing port congestion.
 - Addressing labor shortages and employee retention.
 - Establishing a federal Supply Chain Office to unify relevant federal government activities.
 - Protecting corridors, border crossings and gateways from disruption.
 - Developing a national transportation Supply Chain Strategy.
 - Engaging the U.S. and the provinces and territories to achieve mutual recognition of regulations, polices and processes.

Supply Chain Trends

What manufacturers are seeing...

- Lack of predictability across all aspects of Supply Chains is making planning and execution very tough/challenging.
- Impacted by material cost increases, long lead times and shortages and the transportation / shipping delays

What manufacturers are doing...

- Looking for & implementing innovative ways to address these issues
- Offset material price increases through cost reduction efforts
 - ie VA ideas for products and packaging, alternate lower cost materials, increased automation.
- Addressing lead times/shortages by:
 - increasing ordering horizons, increasing inventories, supply diversification, on-shoring, etc.
- More frequent communication with supply chain partners

Emerging Technologies Trends

Strategic investment in various technologies

- Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Systems
 - Helps manage product supply chains by tracking business resources
- Artificial Intelligence (AI)
 - Integrating computer systems into the production process
 - Majority of employers are short staff; AI allows businesses to augment labour & maximize talent
- Robotic Process Automation (RPA)
 - Adapted to emulate the actions of a human workforce and automate specific business processes to work in concert with people.
- Blockchain
 - Use to store legal contracts, track product inventory, and monitor movement along the supply chain
